

NATIONAL GALLERY TO OPEN AT 8 PM FOR
DEDICATION

In order to afford the guests who have been invited to attend the formal dedication of the National Gallery of Art on March 17th a greater opportunity to view the Gallery building and the works of art before the dedication ceremonies take place, it has been arranged that guests be admitted to the building at 8 PM, an hour earlier than the time stated on the invitations which have been issued for the occasion.

This advance in time from 9 to 8 PM will relieve congestion as well as provide a greater opportunity for the guests to see the building and the collections.

Entrance to the Gallery on dedication night will be through the Constitution Avenue and 6th Street doors only. No one will be admitted except those whose names appear on the cards of admission issued by the Gallery. These cards are not transferable.
