The National Gallery of Art announces that, through the cooperation of Brigadier General Robert L. Denig, USMC, Director of the Division of Public Relations, U. S. Marine Corps, a special exhibition of watercolors and drawings by Marine officers and enlisted men, will be held at the National Gallery, Constitution Avenue at Sixth Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., from the 12th of September through the 10th of October, 1943.

The work is amateur in the purest sense, being the product not of artists in Marine Uniform, but of Marines who can paint and sketch and can find time, or are given time, to do so.

Several of the Marine artists, represented in the show, are crack riflemen. Most of them have been in the South Pacific; all of them follow the great tradition of the Corps:

Every man a fighting man.
