WASHINGTON, February 24: The famous painting, The

Peacemakers, by George P. A. Healy (1813-1894) recently

acquired by the White House has been loaned, through
the courtesy of President Truman, to the National Gallery

of Art for the current exhibition of American Paintings.

The picture shows the meeting of President
Lincoln, General Grant, General Sherman and Admiral
Porter on board the "River Queen" off Virginia City,
Virginia, during Grant's siege of Richmond in 1865.
Healy had previously painted individual portraits of
the four men, and a letter from General Sherman to the
artist describing the conference was used as a basis
for the grouping of the figures. The picture was
painted about 1868 in Rome.
