## POR RELEASE: IMMEDIATELY

WARRINGTON, April 7: Herbert Read, English poet, literary and art critic, will lecture at the Matienal Gallery of Art, Sunday, April 18th at 5 p.m., on "Realism and Abstraction in Nodern Art", it was announced today.

Mr. Read, who has just arrived from England, is known to American audiences from previous lecture tours in this country. He is also the author of more than twenty books on art and literature, the most recent of which is The Grass Roots of Art (1946).

A captain in the first World War, Mr. Read fought in France and Belgium (1915-18), and was twine decorated. Later he was subsequent Frincipal of H. M. Treasury and became Assistant Reeper, Victoria and Albert Museum, 1922-31. He was subsequently Watson Victoria and Albert Museum, 1922-31. He was subsequently watson Cordon Frofessor of Fine Art in the University of Edinburgh, and Eydney Jones Lecturer in Art, University of Liverpool. He was editor of the Eurlington Magazine for six years and Leon Fellow at the University of London.

Among his best known books are: Relogues (1919), Reason and Romanticism (1928), Phases of English Poetry (1928), The Meaning of Art (1931), Art Now (1933), Art and Society (1936), Collected Essays (1938), A Coat of Many Colours (1945) and The Grass Roots of Art (1946).

At the Sational Sallery, Mr. Read will speak in the Auditorium on the Ground Floor. There is no charge for admission.
