SUNDAY EVENING CONCERTS RESUME AT THE NATIONAL GALLERY OF ART

WASHINGTON, D. C. September 10, 1971. The 30th season of Sunday evening concerts at the National Gallery of Art begins on September 26, 1971, J. Carter Brown, Director, announced today.

The new season will be launched by three orchestral programs entitled "A Festival of Symphonies", which will commemorate the opening season of the John F. Kennedy Center for the performing Arts.

Other highlights of the season, which will continue through June 1972, will include a Viennese New Year's concert on January 2, programs devoted to the music of Haydn and Mozart in March, and the Gallery's 29th American Music Festival during April and May 1972. Premieres and first Washington performances will figure on both the orchestral and recital programs throughout the season.

The Gallery's concerts, sponsored by funds bequeathed by William Nelson Cromwell and F. Lammot Belin, are under the general direction of Richard Bales, Conductor of the National Gallery Orchestra. The 1971-72 season will mark Mr. Bales' 29th year in charge of music at the Gallery.

Concerts will be given in the East Garden Court of the Gallery on Sunday evenings at 7 o'clock, and are free to the public. Through the cooperation of Local 161-710 American
