WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The National Gallery of Art has instituted a pass system for the most comprehensive exhibition in its fifty-year history, <u>Circa 1492: Art in the Age of Exploration</u>. The exhibition, which will be open October 12, 1991 through January 12, 1992, will include more than 600 paintings, sculpture, drawings, and decorative objects, as well as maps and scientific instruments, from Europe and Africa, Asia, and the Americas.

Advance passes will be available free of charge beginning
September 30 at the Gallery's East Building. Passes can also be
obtained at all Ticketmaster locations and Hecht Co. stores for a
