NATIONAL GALLERY OF ART RETURNS TO REGULAR HOURS AND EXPANDS FRIDAY EVENING HOURS FOR "CIRCA 1492"

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The National Gallery of Art has returned to its regular hours of 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on weekdays and Saturdays, and 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Sundays. Beginning October 18, the exhibition Circa 1492: Art in the Age of Exploration will be open an additional three hours until 8:00 p.m. on Friday evenings. The show will be on view October 12, 1991 through January 12, 1992 in the East Building at Fourth Street and Constitution Avenue, N.W.

"We invite everyone to take advantage of the special Friday evening hours to see <u>Circa 1492</u> -- an unparalleled assemblage of approximately 600 exquisite works of art from Europe and Africa, Asia, and the Americas," said J. Carter Brown, director, National Gallery of Art. Terrace Café hours are also being extended with a special candlelit Friday evening offering of foods and wines from countries represented in <u>Circa 1492</u>.

Admission to <u>Circa 1492</u>, the most wide-ranging exhibition in the Gallery's fifty-year history, is free of charge, but will require passes. Passes obtained from the Gallery are free.

Acquisitions, featuring more than fifty photographs spanning the
career of Walker Evans, one of this country's most important
photographers, will be on view in the East Building, November 24,
1991 through March 1, 1992.
