## ELIZABETH CROOG AS SECRETARY AND GENERAL COUNSEL

Washington, D.C. – National Gallery of Art director Earl A. Powell III has announced the appointment of Elizabeth A. Croog as secretary and general counsel of the National Gallery of Art. Croog succeeds Philip C. Jessup Jr., who retired at the end of July.
