Free Family-Friendly Films at the National Gallery of Art This Summer Highlight *Degas/Cassatt*

With a full summer schedule of free activities, as well as creative toys and gifts in the Children's Shop and casual dining in the Cascade Café, the National Gallery of Art welcomes families to explore and enjoy great works of art.

Edgar Degas is in a time of crisis following the death of his father. Saddled with debt, struggling to survive, he derives unexpected inspiration from Marie, a young aspiring ballerina who convinces Degas to persevere in the face of relentless criticism from the Parisian art establishment. At the same time, Degas helps Marie tap into the incredible talent she doesn't believe she has, especially when compared to her beautiful and confident sister Pauline. In the hours they spend together as artist and model, they become friends and confidants, finding in each other what they most need to move forward and follow their dreams. Mary Cassatt: American Impressionist

Ages 8 and up

This story finds American artist Mary Cassatt—intelligent, charming, and fiercely independent—living an ordered life in Paris until her brother arrives with his three unruly children. At first dreading the presence of the children, she soon finds herself inspired by them and even uses them as models. Her teenage niece Katherine, who believes that marriage is essential to positioning oneself in society, plays matchmaker between Cassatt and Edgar Degas. Though the match is not meant to be, Cassatt's feminist ideals greatly influence Katherine and change her life forever and for the better. Likewise, the children soften Cassatt and inspire her to renew stronger contact with her family in Philadelphia. (Richard Mozer, Devine Entertainment, Canada, 1999, 56 minutes)

The National Gallery of Art and its Sculpture Garden are at all times free to the public. They are located on the National Mall between 3rd and 9th Streets at Constitution Avenue NW, and are open Monday through Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Sunday from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The Gallery is closed on December 25 and January 1. With the exception of the atrium and library, the galleries in the East Building will remain closed for approximately three years for Master Facilities Plan and renovations. Visitors will be asked to present all carried items for inspection upon entering. Checkrooms are free of charge and located at each entrance. Luggage and other oversized bags must be presented at the 4th Street entrances to the East or West Building to permit x-ray screening and must be deposited in the checkrooms at those entrances. For the safety of visitors and the works of art, nothing may be carried into the Gallery on a visitor's back. Any bag or other items that cannot be carried reasonably and safely in some other manner must be left in the checkrooms. Items larger than 17 by 26 inches cannot be accepted by the Gallery or its checkrooms.
