Abstract This collection documents the life of Edith A. Standen from the

age of sixteen until her death in 1998. The bulk of the materials consists of personal daily diaries that she kept from 1921 until her death. The collection also includes papers relating to her service in the Women's Army Corps (WAC), and as an officer with the Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives (MFAA) Section of the United States Military Government in Germany immediately after

World War II.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection consists primarily of diaries written by Edith Appleton Standen beginning in 1921, when she was 16 years old, and ending in 1998, the year of her death at age 92. The diaries document her activities as the secretary for the Widener Collection, her work in the Women's Army Corps (WAC) and as a captain in the Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives (MFAA) Section of the United States Military Government, as well as her general involvement in the art world during her years as Curator of Textiles at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Standen often placed loose items that she wished to save between diary pages for security. These items have been removed from the diaries and placed separate folders.

The collection reflects Standen's military service, particularly her assignment as officer-in-charge of the Central Collecting Point, Wiesbaden, from August 1946 through August 1947. During this period she was responsible for overseeing the recovery, protection, and return of looted works of art. On November 7, 1945, Standen signed the Wiesbaden Manifesto, a document opposing the military decision to transport 202 German-owned paintings to the National Gallery of Art, Washington, for safekeeping. The materials in these files include official military records, personal correspondence and essays, catalogues for art exhibitions held at Wiesbaden and other collecting points, and various other publications.

There are also four small files relating to Standen's position as secretary to the Widener Collection at Lynnewood Hall, Elkins Park, Pennsylvania, and her role in overseeing transfer of the collection to the National Gallery of Art, Washington in 1942. These files consist of correspondence, essays, and an annotated catalogue of the collection.

Additionally, this collection contains files relating to Standen's involvement in various study tour groups and historical preservation societies in her later years. These materials primarily consist of pamphlets, maps, and lists of tour participants.

Of special interest are approximately 500 photographs from Standen's diaries and files which document her life, and in particular the work of the MFAA.

ORGANIZATION

Series H1 DIARIES, 1921 - 1998 (with gaps)
Arranged chronologically

This series consists of 76 bound volumes written by Standen throughout the course of her life. Her diaries document her activities as secretary to the Widener Collection, as a member of the Women's Army Corps, as a Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives (MFAA) officer, and as Curator in the Textiles Study Room at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, as well as her private life.

The diaries originally contained inserted documents and photographs which have been marked, removed, and filed separately in order of the corresponding diary entry. A file of items removed, which includes photocopies of any inserted photographs, has been created for each bound diary. The diaries and folders of related materials are located in the same box, and are organized to be looked at simultaneously. Original photographs are included in series H7.

Series H2 WIDENER COLLECTION MATERIALS, 1906, 1931-1966 Arranged chronologically

This series documents Standen's work as secretary to the Widener Collection. Materials include correspondence, an annotated catalogue and notes and essays related to the collection.

Series H3 WAR-RELATED SUBJECT FILES, 1937 - 1990 Arranged alphabetically by subject

This series consists of materials relating to Standen's service in the United States Military during and after World War II as a member of the Women's Army Corps (WAC), and the Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives (MFAA) Section of the United States Military Government in Germany. They include official military reports, orders and correspondence, a copy of the *Wiesbaden Manifesto*, as well as Standen's personal correspondence and writings. Of particular note are a lithograph, a cigarette case, and a box with 72 photographs of works of art mounted on cards accompanied by a bound catalogue.

Series H4 WAR-RELATED ART EXHIBITION CATALOGUES, 1939 - 1951 Arranged alphabetically by title

This series is composed of catalogues of art exhibitions displayed during Standen's service in Germany. The majority of these exhibitions were organized by Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives (MFAA) officers at the Munich and Wiesbaden collecting points. These materials are predominantly in German, with some in English and French.

Series H5 PUBLICATIONS OTHER THAN ART EXHIBITION CATALOGUES, 1945 - 1994 Arranged alphabetically by author and title

This series consists of published articles, newspaper clippings, and Standen's copy of *The Rape of Europa* by Lynn Nicholas.

Series H6 HISTORIC PRESERVATION ACTIVITIES, 1951-1971 Arranged alphabetically by subject

This series is comprised of materials relating to study tours, conferences, and historic preservation activities in which Standen engaged during the 1950s and 1960s. The materials include tourist pamphlets, maps, and lists of participants.

Series H7 PHOTOGRAPH PRINTS, 1930-1998 Arranged chronologically

This series consists of photographs removed from Standen's files of military records and from her diaries, many of which duplicate one another. (The source of each image is recorded in processing notes if needed.) The photographs primarily track her activities as an officer of the Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives (MFAA) Section, particularly the handling of looted works of art at the Central Collecting Point, Wiesbaden. The series also includes photographs relating to Standen's private life and family and her involvement in various art and museum study groups.

Series H8 NEGATIVES, 1930 - 1998

For conservation purposes, negatives are stored separately from the photograph prints.

Series H9 GLASS SLIDES, 1946 - 1947

For conservation purposes, glass slides are stored separately from the photograph prints.

Series H10 DIGITAL SCANS
