SCHWITTERS-STEINITZ COLLECTION

(9.5 linear feet in 17 boxes)

The Schwitters-Steinitz Collection was acquired by the National Gallery of Art Library in 1976. It was formed by Katie Steinitz, American artist and librarian born in Germany, and consists of printed and manuscript material about the 20th century Germany artist and writer, Kurt Schwitters.

The collection was processed and catalogued by Jane Collins with the help of Sharon Millman in 1993.

Additional items were purchased from Ilse Steinitz Berg, Steinitz's daughter, in 1997 and processed and catalogued by Jane Collins in 2007.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Schwitters-Steinitz Collection consists of hundreds of items and includes photographs, scrapbooks, musical scores, slides, drafts of books, articles, plays, poems and an opera libretto, a phonograph record, correspondence (between Schwitters and Steinitz and Steinitz and others), clippings, exhibition catalogs, dealer catalogs, periodicals and memorabilia all related to Kurt Schwitters. It was formed over a period of 50 years and, up-on Steinitz' death in 1975, was sold to the National Gallery of Art Library by Zeitlin & Verbrugge, book dealers in Los Angeles, in 1976.

Certain documents were in such brittle or fragile condition that they were photocopied on acidfree paper. The photocopies, marked with the box number, item number and "NGA" on the back, are incorporated with the rest of the papers. The originals, which can be examined only with special permission from the Executive Librarian, can be found in Boxes 13-14.

BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION ON KATIE STEINITZ

(Based on the chronology published in the Wilson Library Bulletin, January 1970)

Born on August 2 in Beuthen, Silesia, Germany (now Poland).

1889

1899 Judge Arnold Trauman, her father, transferred the Berlin. 1900 Attends high school in Berlin. 1901 First visit to a museum. "From that day on, there was nothing more important in my life than art." 1908 Art studies begin under Käthe Kollwitz. 1909 Two years of art studies begin at Studien Ateliers. "They called me *Hauptmatador*, the head matador, and surely I killed the beautiful white canvas with violent, sweeping brush strokes." Studies under H. Woelffin, among others. 1913 Continuation of studies at the Sorbonne and other schools in Paris. Marries Ernst Steinitz, M.D. 1914 Ilse Steinitz born. Dr. Steinitz has to join army as military physician. 1917 Dr. Steinitz called from the front to serve near Hanover. 1918 Moves to Hanover with Ilse and Lotti, second daughter. 1918-1936 Life in Hanover as artist and writer; friendship and work with Kurt Schwitters, fellow artist and writer. Collaborations produce children's books, opera librettos, books, and festivals. 1936-1942 Family flees from Pre-Hitlerian atmosphere to New York City. Assists Dr. Steinitz in his practice, works as free-lance artist. "As I had no other literary outlet, I wrote letters describing our experience. I had given up writing pleasant little feature stories. The shock of the German events had been too violent." Later, art studies continue, exhibitions in New York Public Library branches. Arranges "Great Americans" art exhibit at 1939 World's Fair. 1942 Death of Dr. Steinitz. Moves to California to join daughters, both married. 1943 Meets Elmer Belt, M.D. "I was sick, but not aware that my ailment, a kidneystone, was, in fact, my greatest capital. It brought me to Dr. Elmer Belt in Los Angeles, as a patient; ultimately, it made me a Vincian librarian. When I saw, for the first time, the beginning of Dr. Belt's Leonardo da Vinci' Library beautifully housed on the built-in shelves in his office, I forgot my ailments." 1945-1961 Becomes librarian of Dr. Belt's collection. Publications on da Vinci, work on da Vinci exhibitions. Expansion of the library. 1961 Donation of the library to UCLA. Named honorary curator of the Elmer Belt Library of Vinciana by Librarian Lawrence Clark Powell and Chancellor Franklin D. Muprhy. "On my way across the

deep forest of books, friendly light was thrown by a great librarian, Lawrence Clark Powell."

- 1968 English book on Schwitters published.
- Delivers, by invitation, the in the *Lettura Vinciana* in Vinci, Italy, a crowning honor for scholars in the field. Exhibit of Kate Steinitz Collection and of her work at the Los Angeles County Museum.
- 1975 Dies April 7 in Los Angeles.

DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS

This description of contents is based on a list from Zeitlin & VerBrugge, book dealers in Los Angeles, who sold the collection to the National Gallery of Art Library in 1976. It includes the items found by Jane Collins, Manuscript Cataloger, in April and May 1993.

The arrangement follows the original Zeitlin list, but the numbering scheme is new. The descriptions include notes from the Zeitlin list and additional notes by Jane Collins

The two numbers appearing at the end of each entry within square brackets refer to the number on the original typed Zeitlin list, and the number appearing in pencil on each piece in the collection, if there is one, receptively.

NOTE: The list was created in August 1993 using WordPerfect so that it can be searched by keyword. Ask a Reference Librarian for help in searching the list by keyword if you are looking for a specific title or a specific person. (C:\WP51\STEINITZ.DOC) Changes were made to the finding aid in Feb. 2007 to reflect the addition of Section 10: Items from Kate Steinitz's daughter, Isle Steinitz Berg.
