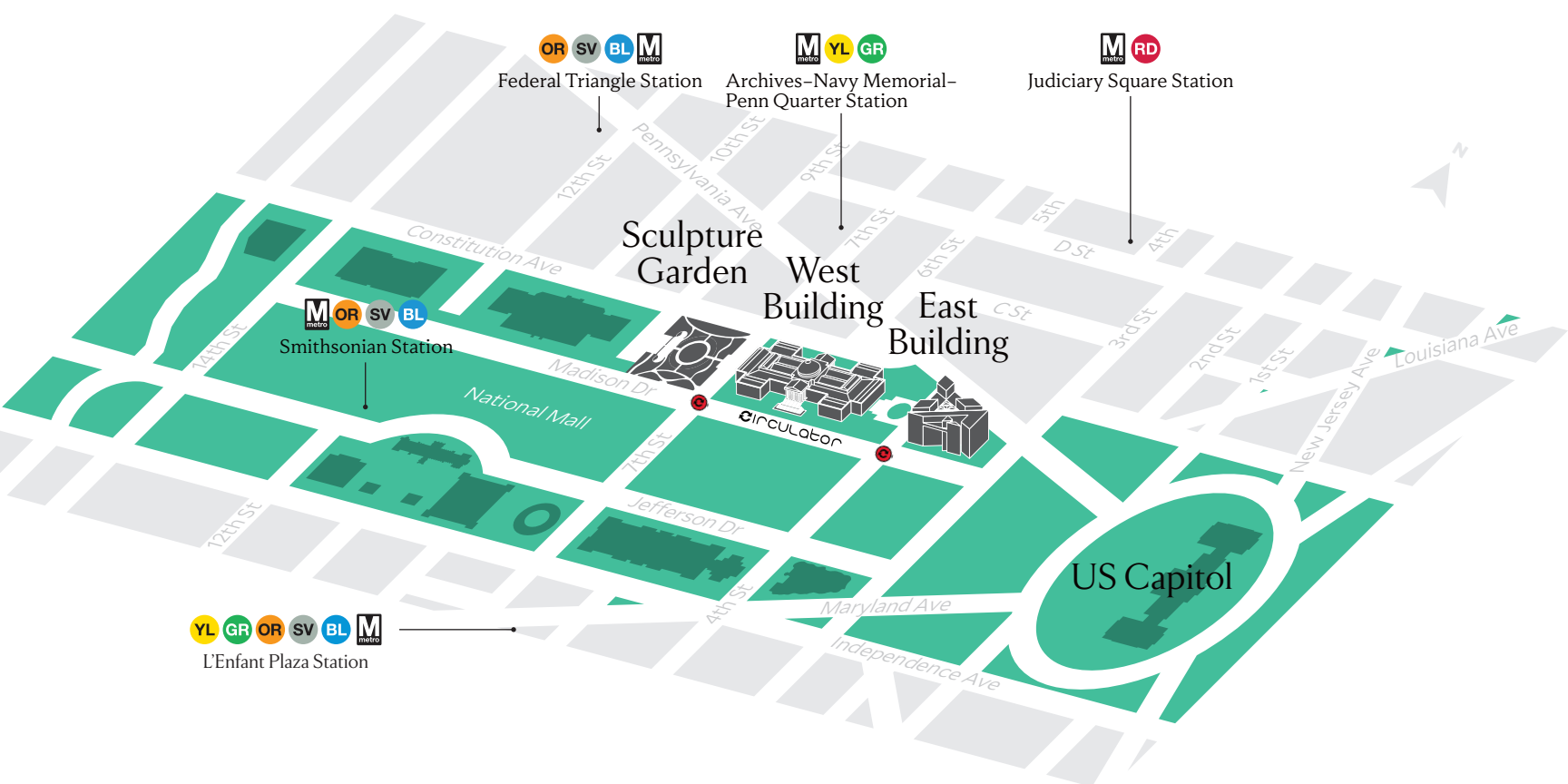

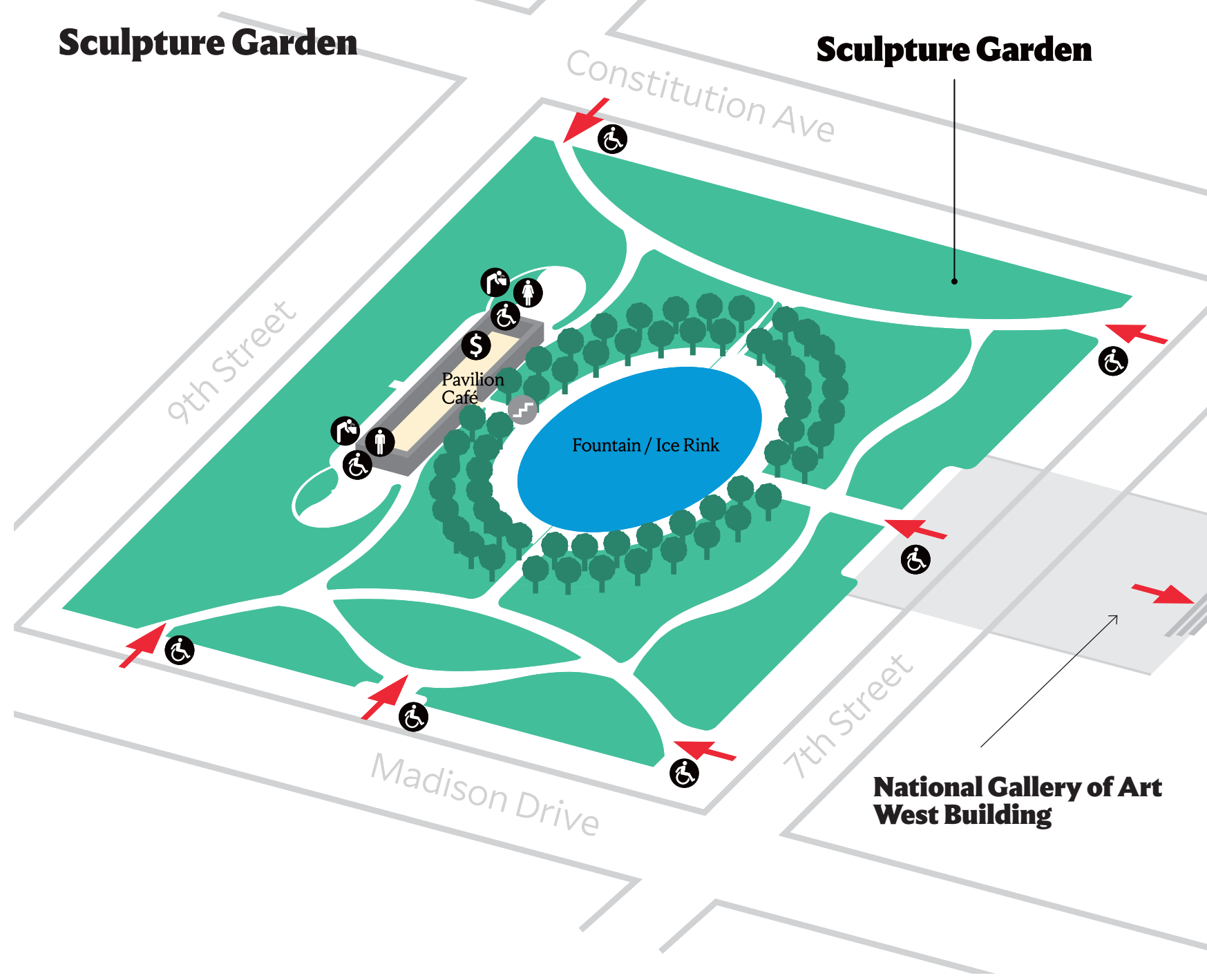
Museum Map

The Sculpture Garden is a peaceful setting for monumental modern sculptures.

The East Building presents modern and contemporary works by artists from around the world as well as special exhibitions.

The West Building is home to European paintings and sculptures from the 13th to early 20th centuries as well as American art from the 18th century to the early 1900s. Decorative arts, the Kaufman Collection of American furniture, and rotating installations of prints, drawings, rare books, and photographs are also displayed in the West Building.

The library houses invaluable resources for researchers: more than 500,000 volumes on Western art and architecture dating to the Middle Ages and a collection of rare books.
